Location

ND is centrally located in the center of Caguas. However, its large campus is a green oasis with fountains and trees. The school is within walking distance of the public transportation system and direct and immediate access to the 2 avenues and 1 street.

Objective and mission

NDS has been a catholic institution since it first opened its doors on the October 3, 1916. Its goal as a first rate college preparatory school is to empower its students to evangelize through the pursuit of justice. respect for global diversity and solidarity with the destitute and marginal members of society.

Students

NDS has, over one thousand students who come from Caguas, the eastern and central part of the island. This diversity in our students result in a comprehensive clientele conducive to a greater variety of curricular offers not possible in a smaller school.



School Organisations

The school's academic environment is strengthened by numerous student organizations. Among these are: Scala, the oldest running school newspaper in Puerto Rico, founded in 1946; Chemistry Club, founded in 1948; Student Council and Forensics. founded in 1956; Oratory Club, founded in 1957; National Honors Society, founded in 1966; School Band, founded in 1985; Student Counselors, founded in 1986, TEA (Artistic Expression), founded in 1989, Grupo Huellas (Religious Action club), founded in 1990; Missionary Group, founded in 1990; English Club, also founded Green Suns (proecology), Youth Ministry Club and Chess Club all founded in 2005 and those founded in the last decade.

Faculty.

To care for the needs of the students, NDS has an academic and administrative staff with a proven track record. The teacher-student ratio is one student for every sixteen students. The school's staff includes three counselors, a discipline councelor, a social worker, seven heads of department, one teacher coordinator per grade, a school headmaster, a elementary school principal, three associate principals, the teaching staff, as well as visiting Redemptories missionaries and volunteers that collaborate in the formation of our students.

Costs and Educational Aid.

Our costs are significantly lower compared to those of other similar educational institutions. The costs for 2023/24 of grades 5 to 12 are: registration fee of \$995, and a tuition of \$ 3,950. The tuition can be divided in 10 monthly's instalments.

We offer scholarships to lower income students with a high grade point average.

Major Facilities

Built in harmony with its surroundings, the school's facilities are modern and functional and with the charm of tradition. They include a chapel, **3** laboratories for the plastic arts. 4 laboratories reserved to the teaching of Science, 2 for computers, 1 for History, 1 for robotics and 1 for English composition. Internet access throughout the campus makes each classroom a potential virtual class laboratory.

The integrated but independent facilities of the library, art gallery and a cybercafé make a functional and attractive studies facilities. This complex has immediate access to the computer laboratories, internet and printing services. Sala San Alfonso a multiple use facility of **2,836 ft**² can also be connected to this complex.

ND's parking facilities, the 12,666 square feet air conditioned Neumann Hall with its dining area and theater, its extensive sports areas and facilities, which include indoor and outdoor courts, boys' and girls' showers, air conditioned classrooms and laboratories allow ND to implement an integral and pertinent curriculum.






